Some of us walk into Advent tethered to our unresolved yesterdays the pain still stabbing, the hurt still throbbing. It's not that we don't know any better, it's just that we can't stand up anymore by ourselves. On the way to Bethlehem, will you give us a hand?

Advent! The word advent comes from the Latin word ADVENTUS which means "Coming" What's coming? Christmas, of course, the celebration of the birth of Jesus. With the celebration of Christmas there comes many long-standing traditions. Children are eagerly waiting for the coming of Santa Claus. Now, some things are a bit different today than they were when I was a young boy. At this time in early December, most of us probably wrote a letter to Santa. I did! Today many children send emails to Santa!

Just the other day I saw a cartoon: a young boy is sitting on Santa's lap. Santa is saying: "And what would you like for Christmas?"

The boy is staring at him saying, "Didn't you get my email?"

As we are moving forward toward Christmas, and as we are giving some thought to our own Christmas list, I can't imagine we could do any better than the words of David Foster's song "My Grown-up Christmas List". The words of the refrain are so powerful and meaningful for this time:

> No more lives torn apart That wars would never start And time would heal all hearts And everyone would have a friend And right would always win And love would never end, no This is my grown-up Christmas list.

The journey of Advent is one that finds many of us rushing around from one thing to another. It finds others with calendars that feel too empty and still others with tear-filled memories. So, I always try to encourage people to put more emphasis on the spiritual aspects of Christmas.

In a book titled, *Unplug the Christmas Machine: A <u>Complete</u> Guide to Putting REAL Love and Joy Back into the Season,* the focus is on helping people prepare for the Christmas they want to have, that meets their needs and values, and how to make that a loving and joy-filled experience.

I encourage you to focus more on the spiritual aspects of this season. Try your best, during this busy time, to come to church for worship as Reverend Bonnie Olson and I share encouraging Advent/Christmas Messages and each week the Advent Candles, representing Hope and Peace and Joy and Love, will be lit by church families. Experience a renewed sense of the coming of God as you take some time to remember others especially those in need, the lonely, those who have recently experienced the death of a loved one. Make the time to be with family friends that are dear to you. I encourage you to be open and watchful for God's coming to us in new and meaningful ways this Advent season. And finally, I encourage you to follow the Christmas Pledge, which is found in the book, *Unplug the Christmas Machine*.

Pastor's Message

There are all kinds of thresholds in life. Sometimes they are defining moments that stop us in our tracks. All of them help shape who we are and how we understand our place in the world and with each other. They are big moments like getting married, or getting your first job, earning that degree you worked so hard for. Such things are big events. But there are much smaller thresholds we cross that perhaps define who we are even more clearly than the bigger moments in our lives. They are the moments between those big events that slip by us unnoticed. For some of us, it is usually big events or thresholds in our lives that are more likely to draw our attention to God whether in thanks or petition: "Thank you, God for the blessing! Make haste to help me O God!" But our life in Christ is far more than the thank you for the blessing or the pleading for God's help when there is nowhere else to turn. Living out our faith begins with our desire to become more mindful of God with us: to open our eyes both to the Christ at work within us and to seek to see Christ in each other.

The season of Advent calls us to a season of spiritual watchfulness, a call to reflect on just how Christ is born in us and our relationships with each other. We light the Advent candles of peace, hope, love and joy. Advent asks us how are we agents of peace in our own families: that recent argument that needs mending; that relative you hurt or who hurt you Where do we see a need for a word of God's hope and promise? It could be your smile that reminds another they actually matter to someone, for loneliness is an epidemic. Where do we try to bring Joy? Before we can bring joy to others, we first need to find it within ourselves. Joy springs from a sense of gratitude for the gifts we have been given: the gift of life and love in Christ.

Can we dare take Jesus at his word that the very kingdom of God Jesus ushered in at his birth is within us? (Luke 17:20-21) May it be so.








Men's Breakfast



Kristian and Joe have been EXTREMELY busy. The list of everything they have done in one month is too big to mention. The main projects were the setup and break-down and clean-



Reflections for this Advent Season

or many years, I was the Director of the Christmas Pageant and the Cherub Choir at my church. As the Fall approached, I would take a deep breath as I anticipated the enormity of the task in front of me. How do we reverently dramatize the birth of Jesus, learn a bunch of songs and readings in just a few short weeks? Frankly, no one really has time for a Christmas Pageant during Advent! It is a busy time of year! Please *don't forget this undertaking involves children – most of whom are under the age of six!*

In the world of Christmas Pageants, there is a predictable pattern. The pageant rehearsals begin with eager adults, full of ideas and plans, so hopeful that we can make this amazing. By mid–November, those same adults are exhausted and losing steam. Soon enough, things start to come together. The children know the songs, the narration is perfected and the costumes are in place. The adults have bonded, enjoyed the giggles and wiggles of children and start to recognize that we have shared a uniquely beautiful experience.

Undoubtedly, there is Divine intervention and glimpses of God in the mix of all this humanness. *When you are really listening and watching a child will lead the way*.

I recall a little boy who was delighted to assume the role of one of the three kings. He walked down the aisle in his crown and robe bearing the shiny gold gift. He knelt devoutly in front of the manger with his hands folded. There was a nano - second tableu and then he took off back down the center aisle of the church running as fast as he could go. The teacher caught up with him and asked "What are you doing?" He answered in a serious, small voice – "sorry, my camel got away!"

Then, when you are really listening and watching a child will lead the way.

I invite you to reflect on these questions this Advent Season.

- What is it that gets away from us as we try to worship the Christ Child?
- What things *real or imagined* got away from me today as I try to serve and make a meaningful contribution to my family, church and community?

Sometimes we run due to the enormity of the roles we are asked to assume. We are not usually asked to assume the role of one of the three kings. Nonetheless, demanding roles as pastor, deacon, counselor, employee, employer, caregiver, parent, spouse, colleague and friend. Perhaps, we run due to the sheer messiness of this world. Grief, loss, broken relationships, work, depression, health crises, and finances are exhausting.

Advent can feel a bit like the weeks before a Christmas Pageant. There is *A LOT* to do. We are rushing, behind schedule and people are disappointing us or on our last nerve. I invite you to wait and listen for the Child. In the midst of all this, there is the Christ Child – our very human God. Our God who is wanting us to catch our camel and return to worship at the manger.
