Pastor's Message

Dear the Garden City Community Church members and friends:

Eugene Peterson wrote a book titled from an Emily Dickinson poem that says in part: "Tell all the Truth but tell it slant - " *Tell It Slant: a conversation on the language of Jesus in his stories and prayers* makes a case, Peterson says, for

"a continuity of language between the words we use in Bible studies and the words we use when we're out fishing for rainbow trout. I want to cultivate a sense of continuity between the prayers we offer to God and the conversations we have with the people we speak to and who speak to us. I want to nurture an awareness of the sanctity of words, the holy gift of language, regardless of whether it is directed vertically or horizontally. Just as Jesus did." (page 4)

Friends, Peterson describes Jesus as one who, like his ancestors, moved in a culture where face to face story-telling and story-listening conveyed the stuff of life. He describes Jesus, unlike his ancestors, as one who desired to reclaim all language as God language, language that creates healing, forgives, casts out demons, and makes relationships of mutual respect and trust, where all contribute and grow. Reflecting on Genesis and one of the stories of creation, Peterson writes:

"The man and the woman started out so well. They were designed by God himself and alive with the very breath of God. They were in a good place with good work to do - poets working with words, gardeners working with soil and plants - all their needs met, open and intimate with one another, open and intimate with God. They woke each morning to a world of beauty and abundance in which they had dignity and purpose and use.

'Naked and not ashamed': completely at ease, completely at home, nothing to hide, nothing to fear, open to one another, open to the animals and weather and earth, open to God. And then, after a brief conversation with the Snake, we find them desperately sewing fig leaves together to cover up what can't be covered up. The fig leaves signpost language catastrophe. Words are no longer a means of intimacy, of revelation. They're fig-leaf words." (page 264)

Friends, lean in with me. Jesus's stories and prayers revealed the truth about God, our relationship with God, and our relationship with one another and with Empire. Jesus' stories and prayers invite us to practice being and doing without fig leaves, and we practice, first of all, using words to tell the stories of our lives.

The story of your life includes the Garden City Community Church. Your being and doing as the Garden City Community Church, Jesus argues, is your life story too. Your stories about your experience - your first-hand experience - of the GCCC, are the Garden City Community Church story. A story full of angles and perspectives. A story of words and actions sacred and profane; "fig leave" stories and "'naked and not ashamed'" stories. All of them creating the life of the Garden City Community Church: her past and present. All of them creating your life also.

In September, on a Sunday after worship, a date soon announced, you, church, and each one of you, friends, has the honor and privilege to offer and receive your story of the GCCC: this household of faith. I invite you to prepare. Prepare by reading the annotated timeline located along the long hallway at church. Prepare by adding your story chapter headings to the time-line. Prepare by remembering that your story, your firsthand story, when shared and received in community, when described and told as "this is how it affected me..." become stories without fig leaves, creating a Garden City Community Church story "completely at ease, completely at home, nothing to hide, nothing to fear, open to one another... open to God."

Telling the story of your life with the Garden City Community Church. Telling it to one another. Telling it together. Like Jesus did. Don't feel surprised when miracles begin to happen. Healing. Forgiving and forgiveness. Casting out demons. Relationships of mutual respect and trust. All contributing. All growing. All knowing they are made very good in God's image. Amen!

Council of Trustees News (COT)

Dear Church-

Others and I on COT often get asked the same or similar questions so we thought it would be helpful to share an FAQ about COT.

Frequently Asked Questions about the GCCC Council of Trustees

Q) What is the purpose of our Council of Trustees (COT)?

A) The COT, on behalf of the congregation, works in "furtherance of the Church's mission and welfare."

This includes making decisions about the physical property and revenue activities of GCCC, reviewing/
approving the policies and procedures of the Church and its Standing Committees. COT members are
the congregation's elected leaders, nominated from among members in good standing, and voted on
by the members in good standing at the annual meeting.

Q) What is the congregation responsible for?

A) They affirm, choose (vote) and commission the persons who will lead on their behalf, as COT. They affirm, call (vote) and install settled ordained ministers to serve as Senior or Associate Pastor. They may also affirm (vote) and remove installed, settled, ordained Senior or Associate Pastors. They affirm and vote on an annual budget. They may also affirm and vote on action(s) connected to the mission and welfare of the Church at a specially called meeting, action(s) not part of the Annual Meeting. This may include a financial expenditure that exceeds total budgeted monies, or establishing, as happened recently, an ad hoc Search and Call committee.

Q) Who attends COT meetings?

A) Members of the COT attend meetings either in person or virtually. The Senior Pastor and or other Ministers, Treasurer, and Information Officer attend but are ex-officio, meaning, they have voice and no vote. All others have voice and vote: Finance and Administration (F & A), Ministry (Worship), Membership, Programming and the Chairperson of the COT. The Programming Committee on the COT is represented by three, Connections (fellowship), Good Works (service), and Spiritual Renewal (education.) Members of the congregation who have a proposal for COT may also attend the piece of the meeting related to that business. When a vacancy on COT occurs between annual meetings, the COT is empowered to seek and choose a member of the congregation in good standing to fill that vacancy until the next Annual meeting.



Council of Trustees News (COT)

Q) Who can vote at COT meetings? Does the COT need to tell the congregation when it is voting on something?

A) All except those except ex-officio: Minister(s), Treasurer, and Information Officer. They have voice and no vote. The Congregation empowers and trusts the COT to "further the mission and welfare" of the church. There is nothing in the bylaws that directs or requires the COT to disclose meeting agenda items in advance.

Q) How often do you meet?

A) The bylaws (therefore the congregation who must vote on edits, additions, or deletions of the bylaws) mandate no less than quarterly - four times a year. Currently COT meets twice a month.

Q) How can I learn more about what goes on in COT meetings?

A) All COT minutes are distributed to all persons on every standing and ad hoc committee including, Finance & Administration (F & A), Ministry, Membership, Programming, and Search and Call, along with all staff and ministers. Minutes of COT meetings are also posted on the Church website.

Q) What is the relationship between COT and the congregation?

A) The congregation, at its Annual Meeting, establishes "broad policies and directives." They commission, bless, and promise to pray for, honor, and support the work of the COT and its members. The COT promises the congregation to, with God's help, in the words of the bylaws, "work in furtherance of the Church's mission and welfare." The COT advances the work of the church with the support, trust and help of the congregation. The congregation advances the GCCC ministry and mission through the faithful work of COT and its leaders.

Q) Does the COT follow the by-laws? Can the COT change the by-laws?

A) Yes, the COT follows the bylaws. When the bylaws are not specific, COT endeavors to act in the best interests of the congregation. The COT can propose changes to the bylaws but only the congregation can approve the changes.

Mission Trip Recap

On Saturday, July 20th, 16 youth and 6 leaders came back from a life-changing Mission Trip in Knoxville, Tennessee.

- One group built a porch from scratch for Tommy, a homeowner who with his wife was caring for his 5 grandchildren after the death of his daughter from drugs.
- Another group painted the exterior of a house and met Garnet whose sister was undergoing a 15-hour cancer operation in New Orleans and needed our prayers and support.
- The third group removed and reinstalled dry wall in a defunct church. This church, under guidance of Pastor Tim, was being renovated into a shelter for single mothers experiencing homelessness.

The youth also spent time with Pastor Tim and some local children playing games and learning about Jesus. When they weren't working, they were singing, worshiping and learning about their faith. Our youth were clearly Disciples of Jesus this week proudly wearing their Mission Trip t-shirts through the airport, unashamed and unafraid of spreading the news of Jesus and His teachings through their service and daily devotions.

If you couldn't be at service on July 21st please go to the website and listen to the reflections of our youth. You may be inspired to volunteer next year and experience Jesus' love through the eyes of our teens.

Please keep your eyes out for upcoming fundraisers by the Mission Trippers. Funds raised will be used to support Pastor Tim in renovating two churches, one for the women's shelter and another as a transitional home for males transitioning out of foster care. Be sure to join our youth throughout the year, as we continue to serve those in need in Knoxville.
