Pastor's Message

Our stewardship theme for this year "Rooted in Love," is a perfect connection to our Sabbatical Theme for the Lilly Foundation Clergy Renewal Grant: "Behind and underneath all this there is a holy God-planted God-tended root. If the primary root of the tree is holy, there's bound to be some holy fruit," Romans 11:16.

Dear fellow congregants -

Our stewardship campaign this year will include a separate line item for building improvements. Two building projects are proceeding currently – one is the renovation of the chapel and the other is fresh air supply and air purification, making our building compliant as required under New York State building code. Teams of congregants have been looking into the needs of the building, and at times have consulted with professionals in various trades. The Finance & Administration Committee (F & A) and Council of Trustees (COT) have identified the following future building projects:

- 1 Fresh air supply and air purification. We are currently in Phase I of this project. COT and F & A previously approved the amount of \$199,000 for the sanctuary, Gardner Hall, Nursery school (ground floor), Sunday School Wing (basement), and the church office. The expenses of Phase I were paid for by proceeds from our long-term investments. Since then, we've added the air supply improvement to the chapel with the cost of \$25,000. The cost to improve the air supply in Gardner Hall increased when the current units were not capable of repair. We also incurred the cost of a retractable ladder in the sanctuary's balcony. When F & A and COT approved Phase I, we saved for a future date to improve the air quality in the other rooms, which are not compliant with state building code. That date is upon us and the rooms needing improved air quality are the Youth Room, Community Room, World Church Room, Choir Room and offices, and parlor. The cost of Phase II would be approximately \$134,200 \$150,000. In order to protect our long-term investments, F & A and COT ask for the congregation to contribute towards the much needed project.
- 2 **Security system**. Our building's locks and alarm system are antiquated. We have an urgent need for a modernized electronic system that allows for portions of the building to be locked, while others are in use, cameras by entrances with buzzer system to allow the staff to let visitors into the building more efficiently, and key cards that would replace keys. The initial proposal that we received from an alarm company estimated that the cost would be \$25,000 plus monthly maintenance fees; however, we are going to be looking more in-depth at the use of our rooms (who uses which rooms and when, the flow of ingress and egress in our building). We are also considering outside consultants for safety training workshops.
- 3 **Conversion from oil heat to gas**. Our building uses oil heat, which is more costly than gas heat. F&A and COT approved a cost-saving measure, which is to convert oil to gas heat. We need to spend money now to save money later (we will recover the initial investment in approximately three years). The cost of the conversion is approximately \$35,000.
- 4 **Chapel overage costs**. In 2019, we ran a campaign called "90 in 19" and raised funds during our anniversary year for the chapel renovation. Our fundraising efforts amounted to raising approximately \$98,452. We anticipate that the chapel will cost approximately \$20,000 more than we have fundraised.

On behalf of F & A and COT, I hope that you find it within your heart to donate generously this year. You will see on the stewardship campaign materials a separate line to donate to these building improvement projects.

We will be using an electronic voting platform for upcoming church votes. At our September 26th church-wide meeting, we tested ElectionBuddy as a voting platform, and it worked efficiently and securely. We asked the congregation whether to use this system, and the voting response was overwhelmingly in favor. The system allows the voter to choose how they wish to vote - by email, SMS (text), or by hardcopy (you will need to be at church to scan the hardcopy notice).

If you have not yet confirmed your active membership status within the past six months, then you will not be able to vote in the next election. Only those with active membership status who have provided current contact information will be able to vote. The vote on the Associate Pastor is scheduled for November 14th. Any questions about your membership status, or to provide current information, please contact the Church office.

Our stewardship campaign is kicking off this month, which traditionally asks congregants to pledge for the upcoming year. We are asking for additional contributions to cover expenses for much-needed building projects. A letter will be going to your mailing addresses from Kirsten Bahlke and me explaining the details of these building projects. Please give generously.


