Pastor's Message

Dear friends,

The classical view of the brain, Lisa Feldman Barrett explains, describes it as having distinct parts doing unique jobs: sections responsible for thinking, others for feeling, others for movement. 20th century popular culture often referred to the brain as a *triune brain*. The oldest part supposedly inherited from reptiles, with the emotional system inherited from mammals, and finally, "our allegedly rational and uniquely human cortex."

Today we know differently. She writes:

"The human brain... within one physical structure, can reconfigure its billions of neurons to construct a huge repertoire of experiences, perceptions, and behaviors....Complexity, not rationality, makes it possible for you to be an architect of your experience.... The human brain is structured to learn many different concepts and to invent many social realities, depending on the contingencies it is exposed to..."

"Every thought, memory, perception, or emotion that you construct includes something about the state of your body.... A visual prediction, for example, doesn't just answer the question, 'What did I see last time I was in this situation?' It answers, 'What did I see last time I was in this situation when my body was in this state?..."

"All we need is a an exceptionally complex human brain that wires itself to its social and physical surroundings, ultimately producing different kinds of minds." (from How Emotions are Made by Lisa Feldman Barrett) "

Friends, Lisa Feldman Barrett impresses upon us two essentials: the primacy of past experience - one's personal and collective history - that re-forms and shapes current reality, and the primacy of an ever-learning brain that connects to others, to the past, present, and future, and therefore, "different kinds of minds."

The first happens without our awareness, so genius and seamless are we made, constructing efficient and therefore safe and comfortable realities. By comfortable I do not mean one always "feels" comfortable, rather, the moment arrives with familiarity, and action now reflects action past. These effective and efficient moves are essential when in mortal danger, or when wishing to express intimacy and affection. Our brain is not as helpful when we are faced with something for which we have little or no history, or are faced with an unpracticed experience.

At these moments we become, most of the time, time-tellers - not clock-makers (to use the phrase coined by Jim Collins, from my message on May 19th). Time-tellers will avoid, resist, and defend against the unpracticed moment and the seeming strange and new, because the brain is loudly complaining that to do otherwise is inefficient and not effective: "danger" it yells. This protective move, remember, is based on reassembling past experience. Here enters the good news. We can challenge, must challenge, our brain's predictions in the midst of the seeming new and unpracticed. When we do, as we must, our brain learns the new, and with time this practice feels right. The new and unpracticed, when we challenge our brain, becomes comfortable, efficient and effective.

I am, of course, by analogy, describing my life of faith and church life, and your life of faith and Garden City Community Church life.

Jesus' friends and foes, frequently judged Jesus' being and doing dangerous, wrong, confusing, and blasphemous. Of course, Barrett says! Their collective minds and context little prepared them. Jesus challenged and invited them into a new way of being and doing, because "God is still speaking." Jesus invited time-tellers to practice clock-making: knowing full well they would not feel efficient, or effective, or comfortable, until, three years later, a core group of disciples were a body of Christ. Now their collective minds and spirit leaned into their always still speaking God where they comfortably (though not easily), more efficiently and effectively practiced clock-making - growing the Kin(g)dom of God by the leading of the Holy Spirit.

For seven months the collective mind of the Garden City Community Church has, like the disciples with Jesus, experienced and practiced clock-making. Church, you have been learning and growing, though it's not easy, as have I.

Although we always bring the past forward, Barrett says, we can challenge it's prediction. We challenge it by participating, and testing our judgment against the present (new experience). We challenge it by receiving nourishment of other minds. We challenge our collective, comfortable judgements and bias through practicing grace, leaning into failure, courageously resisting time-telling, and following Holy Spirit.

Friends, summer has arrived. Anticipate soon helping make plain this congregation's history: an annotated timeline that illustrates your way of being and doing in all its sweet and all its tart. Look forward to upcoming congregational conversations where Holy Spirit will nourish your clock-making more than your time-telling, as you pray and uncover: *God, what are you calling us to be and to do and become? God, who is our neighbor?*

I am glad to help and be with you on the next part of this journey, and eagerly await your discovering, naming, and claiming your big, hairy, audacious faithful future! Until next time,
