## Abundant Prayer

On my Study Tour to Israel with fellow Garden City Clergy, we made the trip to Bethlehem on the West Bank to see the place Jesus was born. Bethlehem today was probably very similar to the Bethlehem that greeted Mary and Joseph. Guards lined the streets in anticipation of someone thinking about getting out of line. An aura of unrest seemed to permeate the air. We stayed close to our Christian guide and didn't wander off.

In the heart of Bethlehem, just a few minutes' walk from Manger Square, there is a beautiful chapel of Margaret Sitti Mariam, "Grotto of the Lady Mary", commonly known as "the Milk Grotto". It is said that the Milk Grotto was the place where the Holy Family found shelter during the Slaughter of the Innocents, before their flight into Egypt. Mary and Joseph decided to stay there until they knew that their newborn baby, Jesus, would be safe from King Herod's soldiers. Legend has it that Mary and Joseph were in this grotto when the wise men visited them.

The grotto's name is derived from the belief, that a drop of Mary's milk fell down onto the ground of the cave and turned it completely white. In fact, the milky white rock covering the grotto's interior has a magical power. For ages, childless women of many religions have made a pilgrimage to the Milk Grotto, in order to ask for the gift of an offspring. Some of the pilgrims will take the stone powder with them and give it to the people who cannot have children.

As we wandered through the grotto we came to a chapel. It was closed off to the public, with a glass wall between us and the simple sacred space. There she was. A lone nun kneeling and praying with her back to us. She didn't move, like the Scotch Guards outside Queen Elizabeth's Palace. We learned that the nuns take four-hour shifts and pray in the Grotto's Chapel 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year.

The vision of this nun praying struck me. What was her prayer? Was she praying for the past, or praying towards the future? Imagine with me what it would feel like to begin the New Year in an intentional prayer. What would we be praying for? Perhaps it is to restore broken relationships, have a 'do-over' for that one stupid mistake. It might be a prayer of praise, to have gotten through another year. Prayers for health are always included in my prayer list. I suspect we would all be praying that the pandemic is behind us and we can return to normalcy, however we define it.

The Tuesday Morning Prayer Service decided years ago that before we pray for our family and friends for illness, cancer, grief, special intentions, spiritual help and homebound members we say our prayer of Thanksgiving. Acknowledging our thanks is a great way to begin our prayers as there is something each day to be grateful for.

It is my desire that we all begin 2022 praying. Pray for your family, your health, your jobs, your children. Then pray for our church. Pray that we accept the things that we cannot change, courage to change the things we can and the wisdom to know the difference. Pray that we can love one day at a time, enjoying one moment at a time. Accepting hardships as the pathway to peace; trusting that God will make all things right if we surrender to God's will; and that we may be reasonably happy in this life and supremely happy in the next with God. Yes, the Serenity Prayer is my prayer for you. Amen

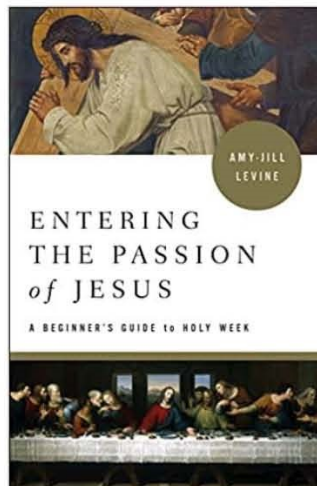

Jesus’ final days were full of risk. Every move he made was filled with anticipation, danger, and the potential for great loss or great reward. Jesus risked his reputation when he entered Jerusalem in a victory parade. He risked his life when he dared to teach in the Temple. His followers risked everything when they left behind their homes, or anointed him with costly perfume. In *Entering the Passion of Jesus: A Beginner’s Guide to Holy Week*, author, professor, and biblical scholar **Amy-Jill Levine** explores the biblical texts surrounding the **Passion story**. She shows us how the text raises ethical and spiritual questions for the reader, and how we all face risk in our Christian experience. We will be looking into the history and literature surrounding the last days of Jesus’ life and analyze the risks and motives of the story’s characters as we travel through the triumphal entry into Jerusalem to Jesus’ prayerful agony in Gethsemane. It will provide a rich and challenging learning experience as we follow Jesus’ final days.

**We take risks as we read and re-read these stories, finding new meanings and new challenges.**

**Amy-Jill Levine**, the author, is University Professor of New Testament and Jewish Studies and Mary Jane Werthan Professor of Jewish Studies at Vanderbilt Divinity School and Department of Jewish Studies. In 2019 she became the first Jew to teach New Testament at Rome's Pontifical Biblical Institute. Professor Levine, who has done over 300 programs for churches, clergy groups, and seminaries, has been awarded grants from the Mellon Foundation, the National Endowment for the Humanities, and the American Council of Learned Societies. Institutions granting her honorary degrees include Christian Theological Seminary and the Episcopal Seminary of the Southwest.

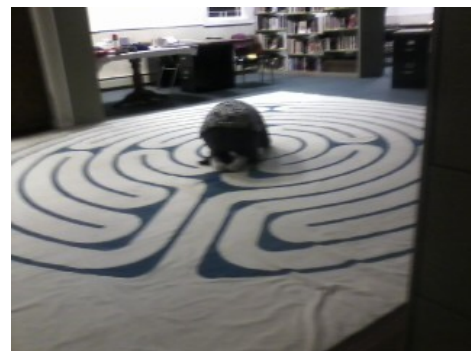

## WALK THE LABRYINTH

Labyrinth walking is an ancient practice used by many different faiths for spiritual centering, contemplation, and prayer. Entering the serpentine path of a labyrinth, you walk slowly while quieting your mind and focusing on a spiritual question or prayer. A labyrinth is not a maze. It has only one path to the center and back out. It has no blind alleys or dead ends as mazes have. The path twists and turns back on itself many times before reaching the center. Once at the center, there is only one way back out. The labyrinth symbolizes a journey to a predetermined destination (such as a pilgrimage to a holy site), or the journey through life from birth to spiritual awakening to death.



We have on loan a labyrinth from the Parish Resource Center and it will be available at the beginning of our Wednesday programs, and after church. Contact the office for other available dates and times.

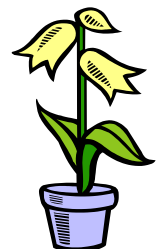
