#### Pastor's Message

I am grateful for the opportunity to serve The Garden City Community Church. I will be one of the Pastors serving the church during the search for the new settled Pastor. I will be working with the Search and Call Committee; leading worship and preaching twice a month; working with the confirmation leaders; assisting with other pastoral needs including Memorial/Funeral services and Weddings; and working with Boards and Committees during this time of transition.

In many ways serving this church is like coming home.

On June 5, 2022, after 37 years, I retired from being the Pastor of the United Church of Rowayton in Connecticut. I was called to Rowayton in 1986 after serving The Garden City Community Church from 1981-1986. I was one of the Associate Pastors, focusing on the Children and Youth Programs. They were such fulfilling and meaningful years, working with Senior Pastor Ralph Ahlberg and (at that time) Associate Pastor Jim Adelmann.

My Service of Ordination was held at GCCC and my wife, Judi and I began our family here, having both Kelly and Samantha while we were here. We had our third child, Michael in 1990. We now have 4 grandchildren. Luca and Everly both 9 years old, Vivienne, almost 2 years old and Scarlett, 6 months.

Life has been amazingly fulfilling as Judi and I ministered together and recently celebrated 46 years of marriage.

There has always be a very special place in our hearts for the friends we established here in Garden City. However, our connection to Garden City goes back further than this.

I grew up in Queens Village, just a few miles from Garden City. My parents had their wedding reception at the (Old) Garden City Hotel. Judi (who was raised in Manhasset Hills) and her parents were members of the Garden City Country club.

After graduating from Grace Lutheran Day School in Queens Village, I received a scholarship to attend Saint Paul's School, Garden City. After graduating from Saint Paul's I attended C.W. 

#### S&C Team Report from September 29, 2024

The Garden City Community Church held its first 21st century "Congregation Meeting and Conversation" hosted by the 10-member Search and Call Team and our guide, the Reverend John Livingston.

We had nearly 80 folks, some who signed-up ahead, and others who joined us spontaneously.

After a blessing and some directions from the Team and Rev. Livingston, and a quick division into our working groups, we were off to work!

These meetings were held throughout the GCCC Church building, including Gardner Hall, the Narthex (lobby), the Sanctuary, the Parlor, and the Kensington room.

The format was to have the group leader(s) discuss the preliminary question, and open the floor to discussion and opinions. Each participant was given two minutes to express their thoughts and positions, and each group had a 2-minute egg timer. That speaker then passed the egg timer off to the next participant.

The Leaders were all awed and humbled by the willingness and thankfulness of all of the participants. Everyone seemed to appreciate "just being asked their thoughts", and they all enthusiastically jumped into the discussion, and sharing some of the high points in their own history, with the Garden City Community Church.

The leaders took notes and shared them (and their own "take-aways") from the conversations, with the S&C team. Our snap opinions were that:

- 1. This was a very valuable exercise, and quite productive.
- 2. The GCCC Congregation was really ready to have these discussions.
- 3. There were some folks who did not have an opportunity to participate.
- 4. And that we should offer follow-up conversations for those who have more to say, and for those who were not able to be present on 9/29/24
- 5. The S&C Team is inviting anyone to join us for informal gatherings, immediately following the Service on November 10<sup>th</sup>, 17<sup>th</sup>, and 24<sup>th</sup>. Get your coffee at the Fellowship Hour and come to the Kensington Room!
- 6. AND there will be a 7:00 pm evening opportunity to meet with us for another Congregational Conversation, on a mid-November date, TBD.
- 7. If you missed the 1<sup>st</sup> conversation, please do join us at one of these dates in November, as your voice does need to be heard!

From the information and opinions gathered at these conversations, the S&C Team will meet and begin the process of distilling all of the input and opinions we've received (and there is a LOT of input to cover)

Lastly, we would like to thank you all for your kind support and willing participation. Your efforts and support make our work that much easier.






#### **Thought Bubbles**

#### Losing a Pet

topic sometimes overlooked is the grief of losing a pet. I will never forget the pain I felt when I lost my beloved dog Snuggles. As a therapist, I often encounter people who also lost pets, and hear of the hole it leaves in their hearts. Combining psychotherapy with Christian faith can offer a comprehensive approach to healing – I know it did for me.

Psychotherapy provides a safe space to express feelings and memories associated with the pet, while being guided through the stages of grief. Processing sorrow, guilt, anger and all of the other mixed emotions are critical in healthy healing. Tools such as journaling, art therapy, and creating a memorial can be instrumental in honoring the pets memory and facilitating emotional release. Support groups for those who also lost pets can remind us we're not alone. Far too often those who are hit hardest by lost pets neglect therapy and suffer needlessly for it.





Christianity offers additional comfort and hope. The Bible speaks of God's care for all creation, including pets, and how all life is cherished by Him. Scriptures such as Psalm 34:18, "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit" provide solace, reinforcing God's presence in times of sorrow. Prayer too can be powerful, helping connect us to God's comforting presence. I personally found the support of my church community and pastor to be invaluable.

While therapy provides a safe place to process loss, Faith provides a hope comfort and strength unattainable elsewhere. This holistic approach respects both the psychological and spiritual dimensions of grief. Ultimately, the journey through pet loss is deeply personal. I hope this article will help those who felt similar loss to me and stand as one more memorial to my beloved Snuggles.
